Full-Service Community Schools (FSCS) Background

We know that, for a variety of reasons, not all students come to school ready to learn each day due to various barriers that they experience. These barriers might include, but certainly aren't limited to:

- hunger,
- housing or transportation challenges,
- lack of early childhood experiences that support learning,
- behavioral health conditions,
- physical health disparities (dental, vision, etc.)

Furthermore, school resources - specifically, finite resources like time, money, staffing, and energy - are typically stretched thin, building those existing barriers even higher for students to succeed.

Whether we like it or not, in order to learn and be successful, those very fundamental needs of students and families must be met, and school leaders and educators can't - and shouldn't be expected to - do it alone. It actually does take a village to prepare students to be successful in life beyond the walls of K-12 schools.

In ND, Full-Service Community Schools (FSCS) are:

- 1. A place (the school itself), and
- 2. A set of partnerships in which all collaborating parties embrace a whole-child, whole-family approach.



The NDFSCS Implementation Cornerstones include:

The NDFSCS Consortium has adopted the Partnership for the Future of Learning's 'Community Schools Playbook Keys to Success' and have adapted these "Keys to Success" as the cornerstones necessary to guide NDFSCS School Sites through the implementation process.

School Site Coordinator

A School Site Coordinator within the NDFSCS Consortium is employed by CREA and is provided dedicated time to extend the capacity of the school by assisting students and families overcome barriers to learning. School Site Coordinators "create, strengthen, and maintain the bridge between the school community by facilitating and providing leadership for the collaborative process and development of a continuum of services for children, families, and community members within a school neighborhood (Coalition for Community Schools)."

Pipeline Services Partners & Providers



Full-Service Community Schools work to align support to pipelines (Figure 1) known to improve student, family, and community outcomes. These integrated

supports are provided through a network of partnerships. *Pipeline Service Partners* are entities that assist with programming or capacity building whereas *Pipeline Service Providers* provide direct services to students and families. Both pipeline service partners and providers serve as extensions of the school for the purpose of increasing capacity to serve students and their families.

Site-Specific Implementation Team

At each NDFSCS School-Site, a school-specific Implementation Team is identified to assess student and family needs, plan, make decisions related to forming and maintaining partnerships with community organizations to implement and evaluate evidence-based programs and services to support identified needs. The School-Site Coordinator serves as the team leader. Additional team members include, but are not limited to, family liaisons, homeless liaison, foster care liaison, Behavioral Health Re source Coordinator, school counselor, special education specialist(s), caregivers, student representatives, and principal(s).

Intentional Continuous Improvement Process

The journey to scale and sustain Pipeline Services as a critical component of the NDFSCS model requires an intentional commitment to a fluid, non-linear process continuous improvement process. Components of this process include assessing needs, planning, implementation, and evaluation.

- **COORDINATE:** Compile data to initiate the needs assessment process in collaboration with the NDFSCS Implementation Team to begin the implementation process.
